The Northern Ireland Audit Office (NIAO) carries out the statutory audits of the financial statements for all public sector bodies in Northern Ireland. This includes all central government, health and local government, in total some 108 audits are carried out each year for bodies spending in excess of £25.7billion. In addition the NIAO publishes public reports some of which are examined by the NI Assembly through the Public Accounts Committee as well as good practice reports which aim to support the public sector in areas of good governance and better accountability. The student training programme

Our students come through the training programme via the ACA Training Contract pathway. The training setup process

Talent recruitment

Our main source of students has been through external recruitment which we carry out ourselves. We liaise with the two Universities in NI, attend recruitment fairs and we advertise through the usual media. We normally start recruitment in the Autumn for role commencement in either April or September of the following year.

Our graduates come from all sorts of degree subjects. There are accountancy and finance graduates, but also graduates from subjects as varied as languages, music, sports studies, law and teaching. Our focus is on the person and their skills. Do they have an inquisitive nature? Can they analyse problems and identify solutions? Are they a team player? Are they a good communicator? It's that diverse, rich set of skills and competencies that we, as an office, are ultimately looking for.

More recently we have commenced the employment of Higher Level Apprentices who study to become Accounting Technicians with Chartered Accountants Ireland sister body Accounting Technicians Ireland - we hope they will apply to our ACA training programme in due course too. That's been very successful for us. In fact, one of our recent apprentices, Aaron Hawthorne, was named Public Sector Apprentice of the Year earlier this year by the Public Services People Managers Association (PPMA), which obviously made us very proud.

We have always seen the merits of training our own students and many have remained with us rising to senior levels within our organisation.
